EXAM RETAKE POLICY:

Exams with less than a passing score may be retaken after a 90 day waiting period. The candidate must submit the retake request form (see below) and pay the full exam fee as well as any fees for re-accessing study materials.

- Quiet room without any technical books, visible papers with technical information, or water treatment reference materials

Certified Treatment Designer Exam Blueprint

The Certified Treatment Designer (CTD) Exam consists of 150 multiple choice questions related to the tasks needed to correctly configure point-of-use and point-of-entry water treatment systems for residential applications or troubleshoot such existing systems.

The tasks reflect the following domains and knowledge areas:

2. WQA Water Treatment Design course

The Water Treatment Design course consists of 4 modules and can be taken as an instructor-led version from the CWS program beginning with <u>Assessing Water Quality Problems</u>, or as <u>self-study</u>, delivered online through the WQA Water Treatment Learning Center. The course addresses the Knowledge Base topics indicated in item 1 above in a stepwise, interactive manner. CTD exam candidates with less than 3 years of experience must complete this course in full before registering for the exam.

CTD exam candidates with 3+ years of experience do not have to complete the course in full and may purchase a three-month access at a reduced fee for the purpose of review. Use the CTD Exam registration form to order the course for review.

3. Personnel who have completed the Water Treatment Design course in full may request a one-time 90-day complimentary access to their learning path after registering for the exam.
